

SPOT *the* SIGNS

Sex trafficking happens 365 days a year.

What is sex trafficking?

Use of force, fraud, or coercion to manipulate another person into any paid sex act.

What To Look For

- Signs of violence: unexplained bruises, black eyes, cuts, or marks
- Behaviors including fear, anxiety, depression, hypervigilance, nervousness
- Easily startled, agitated, or afraid
- Unsure of where they are
- Not in control of money and documents
- Accompanied by older "boyfriend"/ companion
- Dressed to look older or inappropriately for the weather
- Name and/or symbol tattooed or branded on neck, chest, or arms

What NOT To Do

It is not always safe to interact or intervene with someone you suspect is being trafficked. It can put both you and the victim at risk.

- Don't confront. Seek help.
- Do not attempt to rescue anyone.
